HOW?	<ul> <li>Your service provider will identify if you meet the criteria to make a housing referral during your intake into their facility.</li> </ul>				
	<ul> <li>You and your provider will complete the intake form, VI-SPDAT and releases of information to</li> </ul>				
	be pre-screened for potential housing opportunities available in Broward County.				
	• Your complete referral packet will be sent to the Broward Behavioral Health Coalition (BBHC)				
	for data entry into Broward County's centralized intake system (Service Point), managed by				
	Broward County Homeless Initiative Partnership (HIP).				
	Broward County HIP will then determine if an appropriate housing placement is available for				
	you, according to program-specific eligibility criteria.				
WHEN?	Completing a housing referral packet does not mean that housing placement will happen				
	immediately.				
	Many housing programs have waitlists and limited availability. Therefore, you will want to look				
	at all of your emergency housing options until housing is available for you.				
	<ul> <li>Permanent housing is not the same as emergency housing.</li> </ul>				
WHAT'S	Help us help you!				
NEXT?	<ul> <li>Communicate with your service provider(s), engage in services and stay connected!</li> </ul>				
	There is no set timeframe for housing placement, so keep applying for housing as waitlists open.				
	The Section 8 lottery will be posted in the newspaper and online.				
	• It is important to stay connected to service providers (such as your primary mental health or				
	substance abuse case manager) until you are housed. They can provide an important				
	connection to the housing provider so you don't miss out when your name comes up on the list.				
	<ul> <li>You will also need to have a case manager as part of your referral for most housing programs.</li> </ul>

## THINKING ABOUT APPLYING FOR SSI OR SSDI?

If you are an adult who is experiencing or at-risk of homelessness, and who may be eligible for Social Security Administration (SSA) disability benefits, you may be eligible for SOAR assistance. SOAR staff persons are trained to help the application process move quickly and effectively by targeting specific information and submitting a high-quality SSI/SSDI applications.
