NEW BUSINESS

1. Approval of April 15, 2021 Meeting Minutes

Without any corrections, a motion was made by Mr. Paul Jaquith and seconded by Dr. Tammy Tucker to approve the April 15, 2021, Finance Committee meeting minutes.

2. Approval of Financial Statements for March 2021

BBHC's Consulting Chief Financial Officer, Mr. Steve Zuckerman, presented the March 2021 Financial Statements. Mr. Zuckerman addressed Mr. Goldsmith's question regarding purchasing computers as an expense rather than capital since the computers cost under \$1,000. A motion was made by Mr. Alan Goldsmith and seconded by Dr. Tammy Tucker to submit the March 2021 Financial Statements to the BBHC Board of Directors for approval.

3. Update Mental Health TANF to Substance Abuse TANF

Ms. Silvia Quintana explained that BBHC was advised by DCF that an amendment was not needed to transfer funds from Mental Health TANF to Substance Abuse TANF. Instead, DCF performed an internal fund shift.

4. Let's Talk Interactive, Virtual Platform - Vendor for the Care Coordination System/Schools

Ms. Silvia Quintana discussed the selection of the *Let's Talk Interactive* as a Care Coordination platform for the Broward County School System. It will be integrated with their existing system. It was successfully implemented in the Florida Panhandle.

5. Public Comments

Mr. Frank Jowdy announced that he sent Amendment 49 to Ms. Silvia Quintana and Ms. Danica Mamby. The amendment addresses executive compensation. This document will first be reviewed by BBHC's attorney prior to it being signed by BBHC's Board Chair.
